#### Legislation Introduced to Incentivize Energy-Efficiency in Bars and Restaurants

The Creating Hospitality Economic Enhancement for Restaurants and Servers (CHEERS) Act (H.R. 7577) was introduced this month by <u>Representatives Darin</u> <u>LaHood (R-IL) and Steven Horsford (D-NV)</u>. This <u>legislation</u> would expand the Section 179D tax incentive "to apply to new keg, tap, and draft line property on commercial property in bars, restaurants, and entertainment venues" to encourage the use of energyefficient systems in these establishments. For the last 20 years, Section 179D has allowed tax deductions for qualifying upgrades to energy efficient systems on commercial property. The CHEERS Act would also encourage the use of sustainable draft containers and investment in energy efficient draft systems for small businesses.

#### 2022 edition of Standard 90.1 becomes the National Model Energy Code for Commercial Buildings

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) issued a determination that ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2022 will achieve greater energy efficiency in buildings subject to the code. DOE estimates that national savings in commercial buildings are:

- 9.8% gross site energy
- 9.4% gross source energy
- 8.9% gross energy cost
- 9.3% gross carbon emissions

Standard 90.1-2022 expands the scope of addressing building sites and modest requirements for onsite renewables.

## GAC CONT.

DOE is required by law to issue a determination for ASHRAE Standard 90.1, and by March 6, 2026, states must certify that the provisions of their commercial building codes regarding energy efficiency have been reviewed and, as necessary, updated to meet or exceed the updated edition of Standard 90.1

# New Wildfire Policy Report Highlights ASHRAE Standards

On March 12, the Environmental Law Institute (ELI) released a report titled Wildfire Smoke: State Policies for Reducing Indoor Exposure, which is focused on state policies and programs for reducing wildfire smoke exposure and improving indoor air quality. The report references ASHRAE's Planning Framework for Protecting Commercial Building Occupants from Smoke During Wildfire Events, which can be used for commercial buildings, schools, and multifamily residential buildings. It also referenced ASHRAE's Guideline 44P: Protecting Building Occupants from Smoke During Wildfire and Prescribed Burn Events, which is expected to be finalized this year. Guideline 44P will cover commercial buildings, institutional buildings, and multifamily residential buildings, including buildings expected to be occupied by potentially susceptible populations, including children and the elderly. The guideline will address the design, installation, commissioning, operation, and maintenance of building envelope, ventilation, and air cleaning systems to protect building occupants from smoke exposure. I'll be our April speaker with much to share about our chapter history. As September 2024 will be our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we will be discussing our founding process, founding members and some of our major milestones.

And now, a sampling of next year's Historian reports, the brief biographies of founders and legends in our industry. I will be concentrating on one per month, and I'm taking requests:

Edwin Ruud (9 June 1854 – 9 December 1932) was

a Norwegian-American mechanical engineer and inventor who immigrated to the United States where he designed, sold, and popularized the tankless water heater. He was the founder and President of Ruud Manufacturing Company, now a division of Rheem Manufacturing Company.

Willis Haviland Carrier (November 26, 1876 – October 7, 1950) was an American engineer, best known for inventing modern air conditioning. Carrier invented the first electrical air conditioning unit in 1902. In 1915, he founded Carrier Corporation, a company specializing in the manufacture and distribution of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems.

**Reuben Nicholas Trane (September 13, 1886 – September 5, 1954)** was an American mechanical engineer. Together with his father James Trane, he founded the heating and air conditioning company, Trane.
